Community Services Recovery Fund







The Community Services Recovery Fund is a \$400 million investment from the Government of Canada to support charities and non-profits as they focus on how to adapt their organizations for pandemic recovery. Now more than ever, charities and non-profits are playing a key role in addressing persistent and complex social problems faced by all communities.

The Thunder Bay Community Foundation was proud to be working with community foundations across Canada as part of the Community Services Recovery Fund. This fund is a collaboration between the Canadian Red Cross, Community Foundations of Canada, and United Way Centraide Canada to provide funding to Community Service Organizations, including non-profit organizations, Indigenous Governing Bodies or Registered Charities located in Canada. "The Community Services Recovery Fund responds to what Community Service Organizations need right now and supports organizations as they adapt to the long-term impacts of the pandemic. In the local funding stream, The Thunder Bay Community Foundation received \$447,000 to grant to eligible projects. After evaluations were completed earlier this year, 7 organizations were chosen to receive funding for projects that will help them adjust to the implications of the pandemic.
